Highlights of Dorset

- There is approximately 88 miles of coastline in the county, excluding the shoreline of Poole Harbour. It stretches from Lyme Regis in the west to Highcliffe in the east.
- Home to an international airport, cross channel ferry and two universities.
- Two hours from London by rail.
- Weymouth has a bustling port and home to sailing for the Olympic Games.
- Poole Harbour is the second largest natural harbour in the world.
- Dorset is one of the most rural counties in the UK and has more kilometres of footpaths and bridlepaths than roads.
- Dorset's Golden Cap near Morcombelake in Bridport is the highest point on the South Coast of Great Britain, measuring at 191 meters (672 ft) above sea level.
- The Jurassic Coast famed for its fossils, dinosaur bones and rock formations is England's first (and only) UNESCO natural World Heritage Site.
- Dorset landscapes and towns have featured in many a Hollywood blockbuster, including Wonka, Dunkirk, World War Z and Harry Potter and the Half-Blood Prince.
